SOMIO DECISIONS

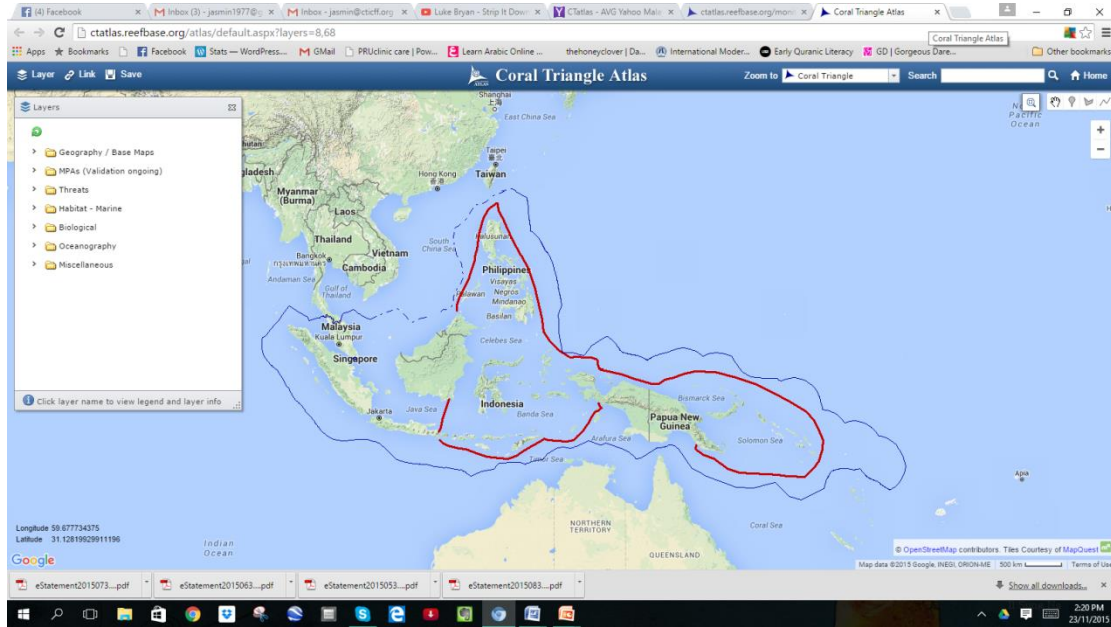
1. Acknowledged and noted the progress in incorporating a web-based database system within CT Atlas particularly for MPA and CCA RPOA indicators.
2. Recognized the key role of MEWG to continue to refine and guide the process towards full operation of the M&E system.
3. Encouraged CT6 countries to nominate respective focal persons, through the Regional Secretariat and the MEWG, for the maintenance, updating, verifying, and sharing of data in CT Atlas on a regular basis.

SOMIO DECISIONS

4. Recognized the need for financial resources for the operation of the system, support for an M&E coordinator, completion of key activities outlined in the Regional Priority Actions and Activities 2013-2016 resulting from 2nd RPW held on August 2013 and development of CT6 and WG capacities to use the system.
5. Noted the development of a GEF Medium Scale grant proposal in support to CTI M&E System operations.

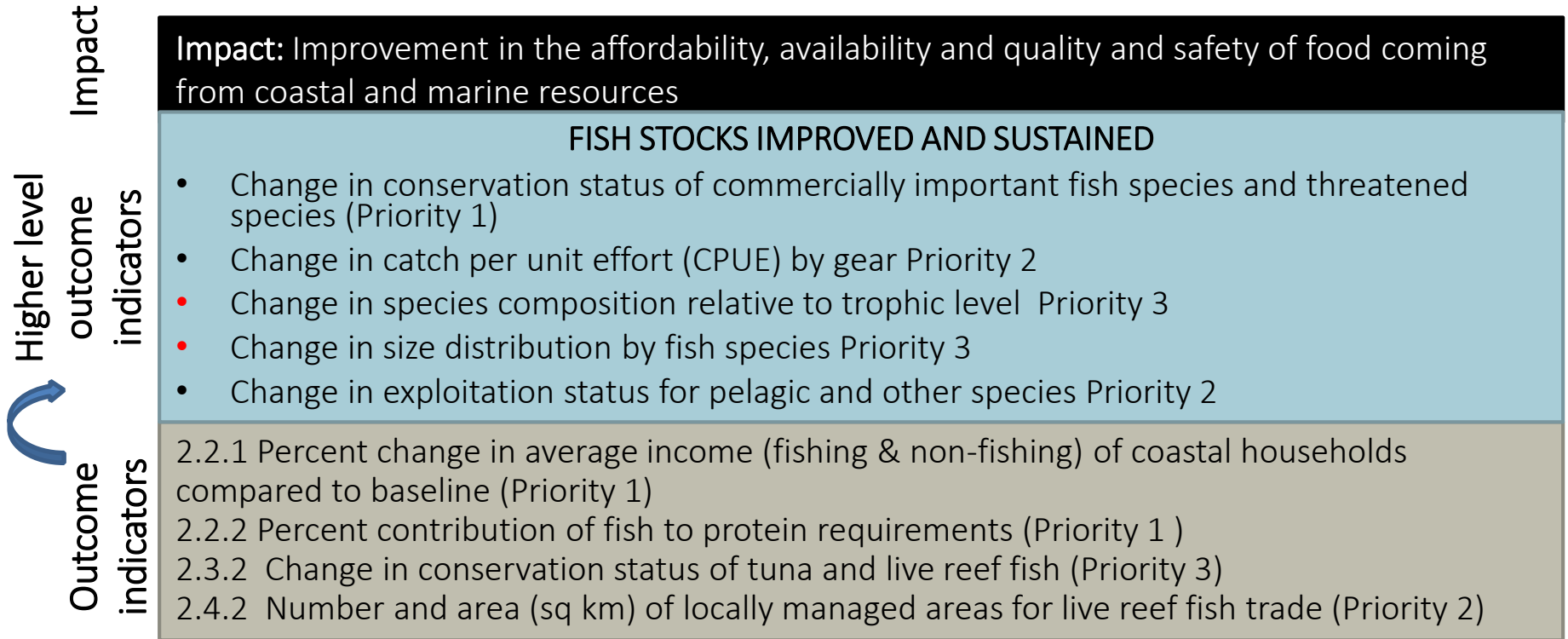

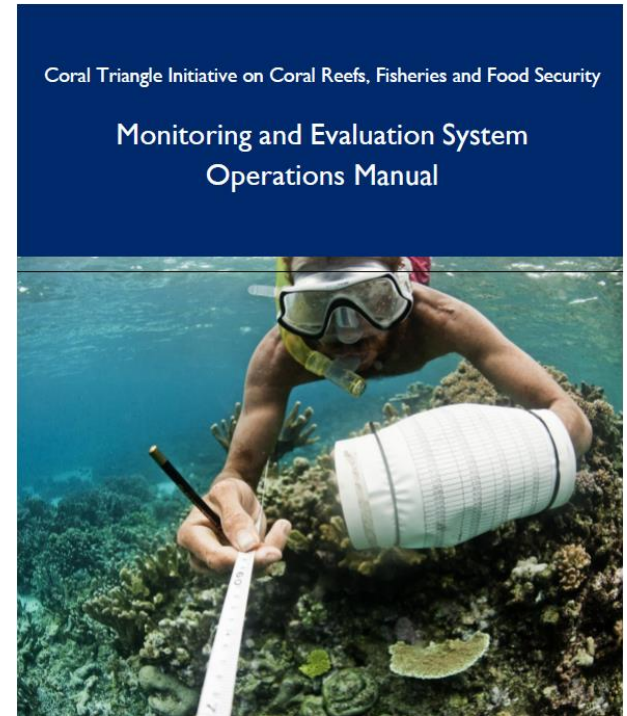
