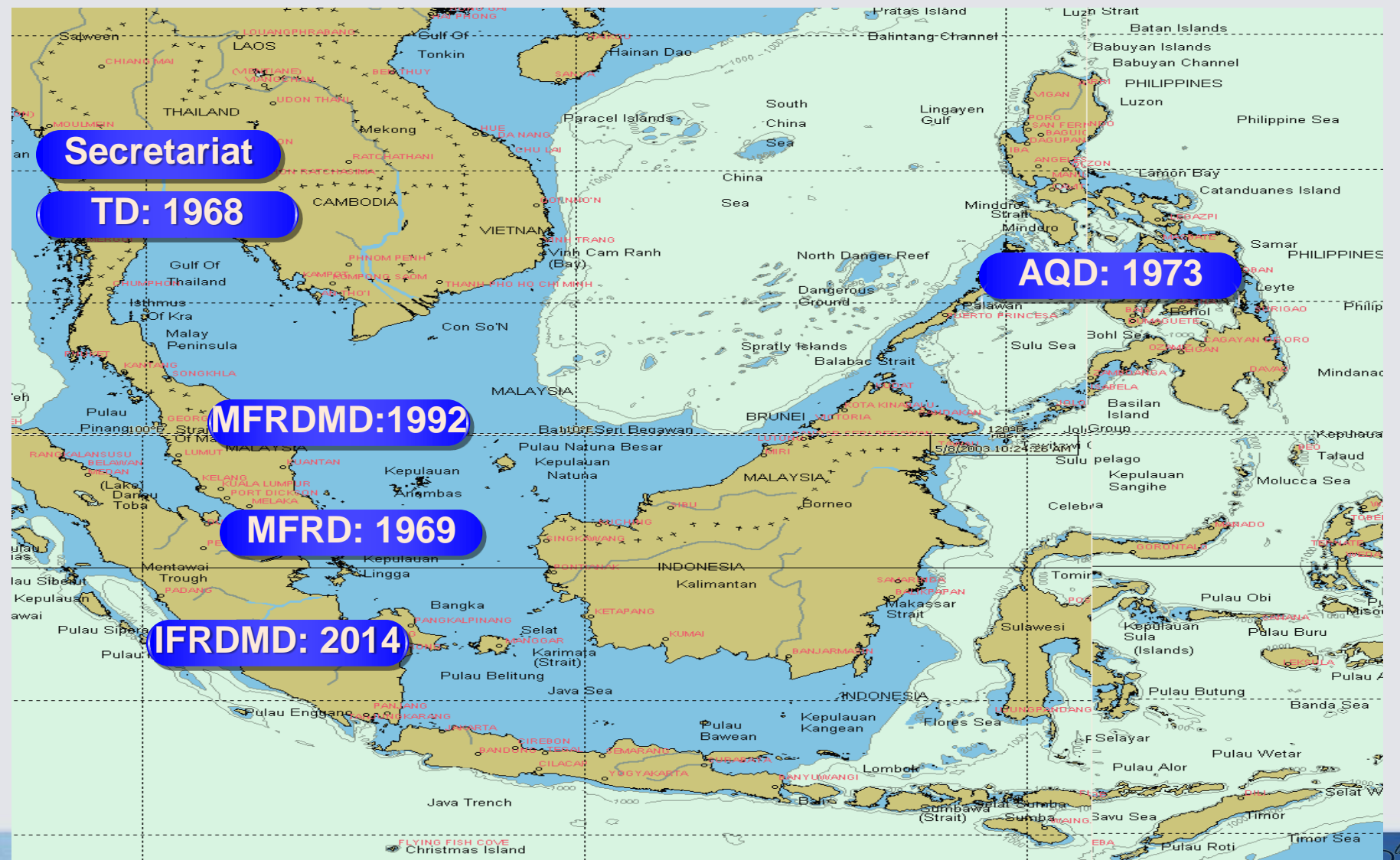

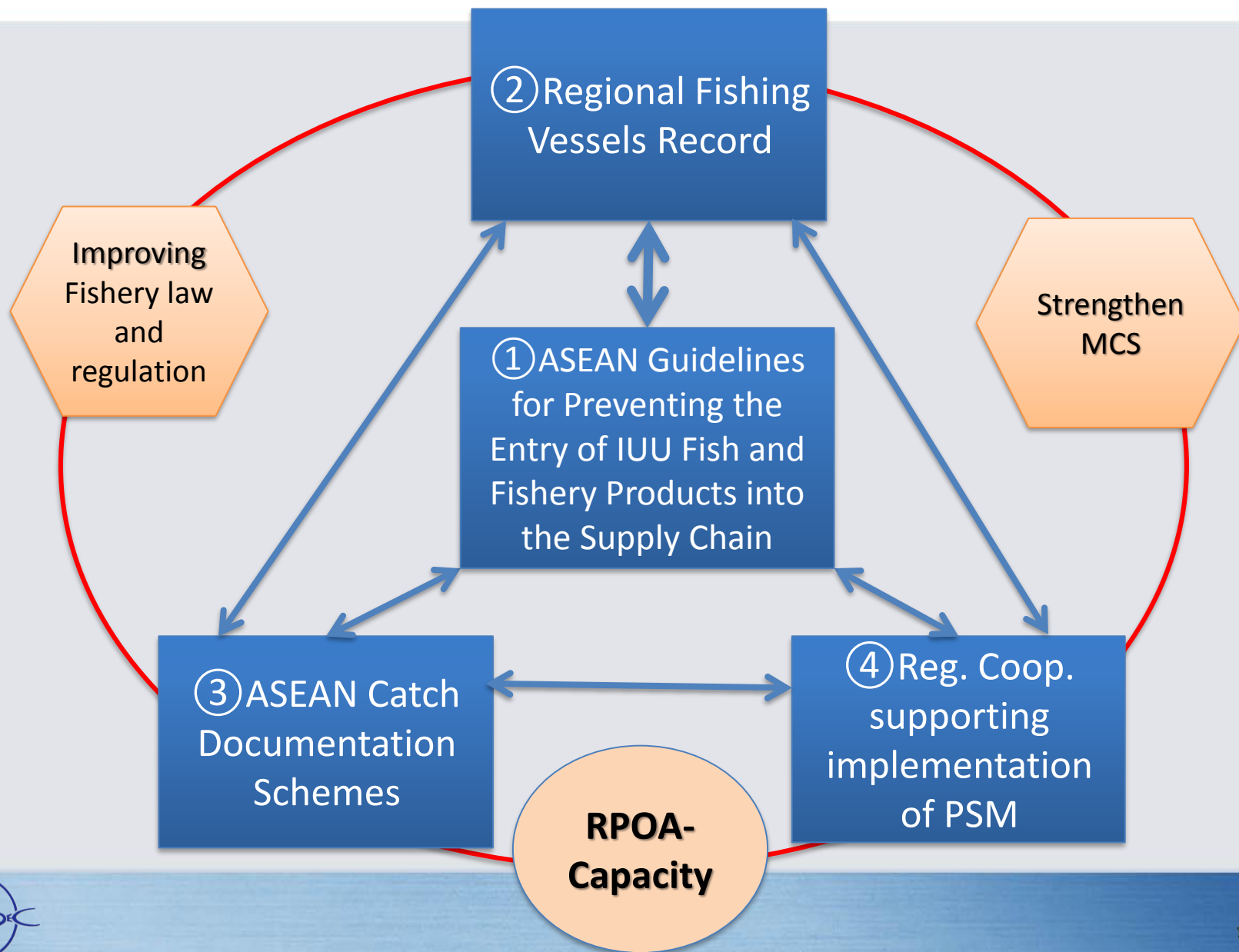

Process for Future Actions

- ❖ Finalize the Draft LOA between CTI-CFF and SEAFDEC on collaborative framework and activities;
- ❖ SEAFDEC to circulate the draft LOA for approval by the SEAFDEC Council and CTI-CFF to seek approval from higher authority; and
- ❖ Signing of the LOA based on the MoU.
- ❖ Starting Implementation from 2016
