**THE 11TH SENIOR OFFICIALS' MEETING (SOM) OF CTI-CFF,
MANADO – INDONESIA, 2-3 DECEMBER 2015**

- Foundations have been laid
- Now need SOM leadership in defining the next phase of the CTI-CFF.
- We identify three key challenges :
 - The large number of 'priorities' requiring Member and Partner support
 - The complexity of institutional structures
 - The presence of a sustainable financing architecture



Key observations

- NCCs are the driving force behind the CTI-CFF and a strength of this regional model
- NCC engagement in technical Working Groups is key.
- Working Groups challenged by the number of priority actions, the level of member engagement and effort
- Resourcing drain for coordination and implementation of regional actions.



The development of a clear vision for the CTI-CFF is the basis for :

- Clearer direction to Working Groups and the Regional Secretariat
- The streamlining of the CTI-CFF and Regional Secretariat organisational architecture
- More effective participation in Working Groups and endorsed networks by Members
- Clearer messaging to other fora
- The readier development of a financing architecture for the CTI-CFF with diverse sources of funding that will support regional and national programming into the future.

1. Direct effort towards the development of a clear vision and strategy.
2. Direct the prioritisation of actions by Technical Working Groups and the development of a clear work plan for the Regional Secretariat on the basis of that vision and strategy.
3. Support a streamlining of the CTI-CFF organisational structure and, with reference to the vision and strategy, and in close collaboration with the Executive Director, promote a flexible and efficient organisational structure within the Regional Secretariat.
4. Take the new vision and strategy and revised organisational architecture to the next Council of Ministers Meeting.

5. Encourage CTI-CFF Members to investigate opportunities to take shared, agreed messages and policy positions on behalf of other members and the CTI-CFF to relevant international and regional policy fora. For instance, ASEAN, the Pacific Islands Forum, World Ocean Council and World Conservation Conference.
6. Provide clarification about the SOM's expectation for consideration of national and regional programs (such as UNDP, GEF, NGOs, foundations and others) which support CTI-CFF RPOA and NPOA activities.
7. Accept for consideration the individual Development Partners' reports submitted to this SOM.
