

INTRODUCTION

The almost 2,000 islands and islets of Palawan are gifted with relatively pristine coastal ecosystems that support marine biological diversity. The geographical location of the province, separating the Sulu Sea and the West Philippine Sea at Southwest of the Philippines, further empahasizes its critical role as a dynamic and important large biological resource in the Western Pacific Region and in the Coral Triangle.

In the past, Palawan was concerned with the condition of the coral reefs mainly because they provide support to fish resources that constitute the most important and popular industry of the province.

However, with the advent of the information that the Philippines is the center of marine biodiversity, and that it becomes urgent to operate the Coral Triangle Initiatives, the paradigm has shifted to conserve not only fishes and the coral reefs, but also the whole ecosystem where they are. This approach is significant, too, for the tourism of the province to be sustainable.

Fish fauna being the major coastal resource of the province in terms of food and source of income of most Palaweños, WWF has engaged WPU in numerous fisheries-related researches the results of which would serve as bases for the conservation and management of fisheries and coastal resources of Palawan. In the process of conducting fish stock assessments, a need surfaced to update the current field guide book **Palawan Food Fishes** 2nd edition (Gonzales 2005) not only because some of the coastal fishes landed are not included, but the book itself is also out of circulation.

Literature on fishes of Palawan is scarce. Only a few exist. Fishes in the eastern coast of Palawan were intensively recorded and illustrated by Schroeder in 1980. Several snappers from Palawan were recorded by Cheong et al (1992), and fishes of Taytay Bay by Curran (1997), while the commercial fishes in Ulugan Bay were recorded by Gonzales and Dolorosa (1994). Mangrove-associated fishes of Ulugan Bay were listed by Gonzales and Watanuki (1996). Among the works of fishes of Palawan, colored photographs were provided by Schroeder (1980) and Gonzales (2000; 2005).

This book provides a photograph-documentation on fishes landed in the coasts around Palawan from 2008 to 2013. Specimens were identified and photographed while fresh in landing sites and laboratory. In the identification of specimens, Schroeder (1980), Masuda *et al.* (1984), Smith and Heemstra (1986), Kohno *et al.* (1990), Heemstra and Randal (1993), Kuitert and Debelius (1993), Mansor *et al.* (1998), Carpenter and Niem (1999a; 1999 b; 2001), Broad (2003) and Fishbase (2012), were followed. Since the players of fisheries sector of mainland Palawan come from different neighboring islands: Luzon, Panay, Cebu, Bohol, and Cuyo, the local names of fishes used often result in confusion. Thus, local names were included in this book, which were obtained through interview, by showing photographs of fishes to fishermen and fish traders/vendors and partly from Herre and Umali (1948) and Schroeder (1980).

To be more serviceable to laymen, and to help in the identification of fishes, the Family, Scientific Name (SN), Common English Name (EN), and local names in Tagalog (TG), Visayan (VS), and Cuyonin (CY) with corresponding indices to these names were provided. For readers who wanted to know more about the fish species mentioned in this book may consult the references listed.

This book does not intend to promote the exploitation of fishes presented herein, but rather aims to document and present an aesthetic guide to the fishes of Palawan, which are commonly landed in the coastal area.

There are 735 collected fish specimens in the Catalogue of Palawan Fishes at WPU, out of these, 613 are marine species belonging to 269 genera and 99 families, representing the running total recorded marine species in the province. This book holds a photograph record of 431 species belonging to 174 genera and 81 families of the coastal fishes of Palawan,

The making of this book was inspired by the continuous demand for a field guide on Palawan Coastal Fishes by different sectors. It is hoped that this book will serve its purpose, and will continue to expand the knowledge and appreciation of the fishes of Palawan, and further its use in the conservation and management of Palawan fishes.



He was awarded a Doctorate of Philosophy in Fish Ecology and Population Genetics by the United Graduate School of Agricultural Science, Ehime University in 1997 for his work on Ecology and Genetic Studies on the Biodiversity of Dragonets in Southwestern Japan.

Dr. Gonzales has published numerous scientific papers and articles in fish biodiversity and coastal resource management in local and international journals. He has also written ten books and book chapters on coastal and fisheries resource management and this is his 3rd book in Palawan Fishes. Aside from his academic and administrative duties, he works with the local governments, NGOs, and communities on coastal management and livelihood. He is a consultant for fisheries and coastal management and marine biodiversity of projects funded by local and international agencies. Dr. Gonzales is currently the Vice President for Research Development and Extension of the Western Philippines University.
