Coral Triangle Initiative (CTI – CFF) On Coral Reefs, Fisheries and Food Security

Adopted on 22 October 2009
by the Governments of Indonesia, Malaysia,
Papua New Guinea, the Philippines, Solomon Islands, and Timor-Leste

I. Background

After the CTI Summit, CT6 governments and partners have a range of activities at multiple geographic scales. Without formal agreement on coordination mechanism and agreeable standard operation procedures, those activities could become overwhelming and disarray. SOM4 needs to have a conversation with partners (in particular the US Government, Australia Government and Asian Development Bank) in regard of the RPOA and NPOAs implementation plan, both for the short-term and the long-term objectives. SOM4 needs to set up a collaborative mechanism that can bring greater coordination, alignment and coherence to these development partners and activities covering among others: planning framework and funding mobilization and channeling.
