Indonesia

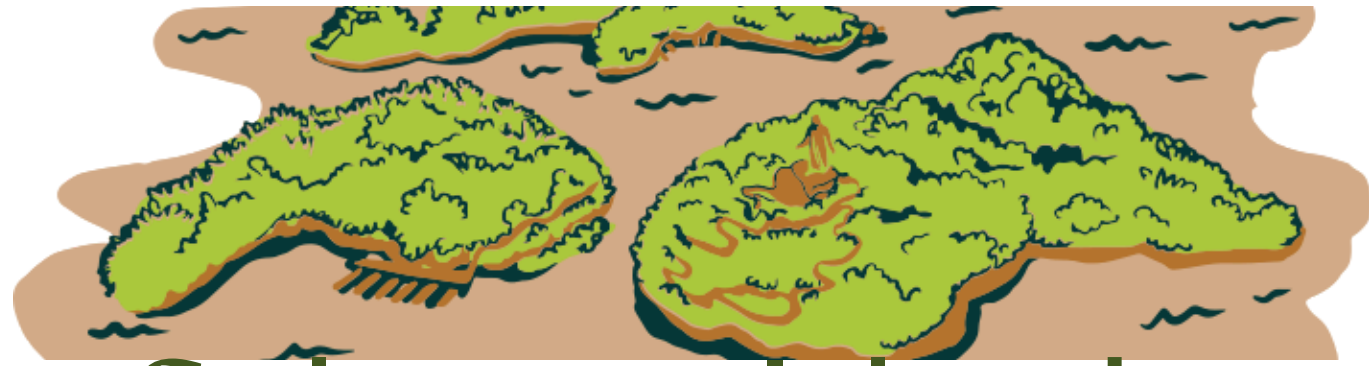
- Ratified the Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination Against Women (CEDAW) through Law No. 7/1984

- The National Action Plan on Gender-Based Violence outlines strategies to combat violence against women (2012).

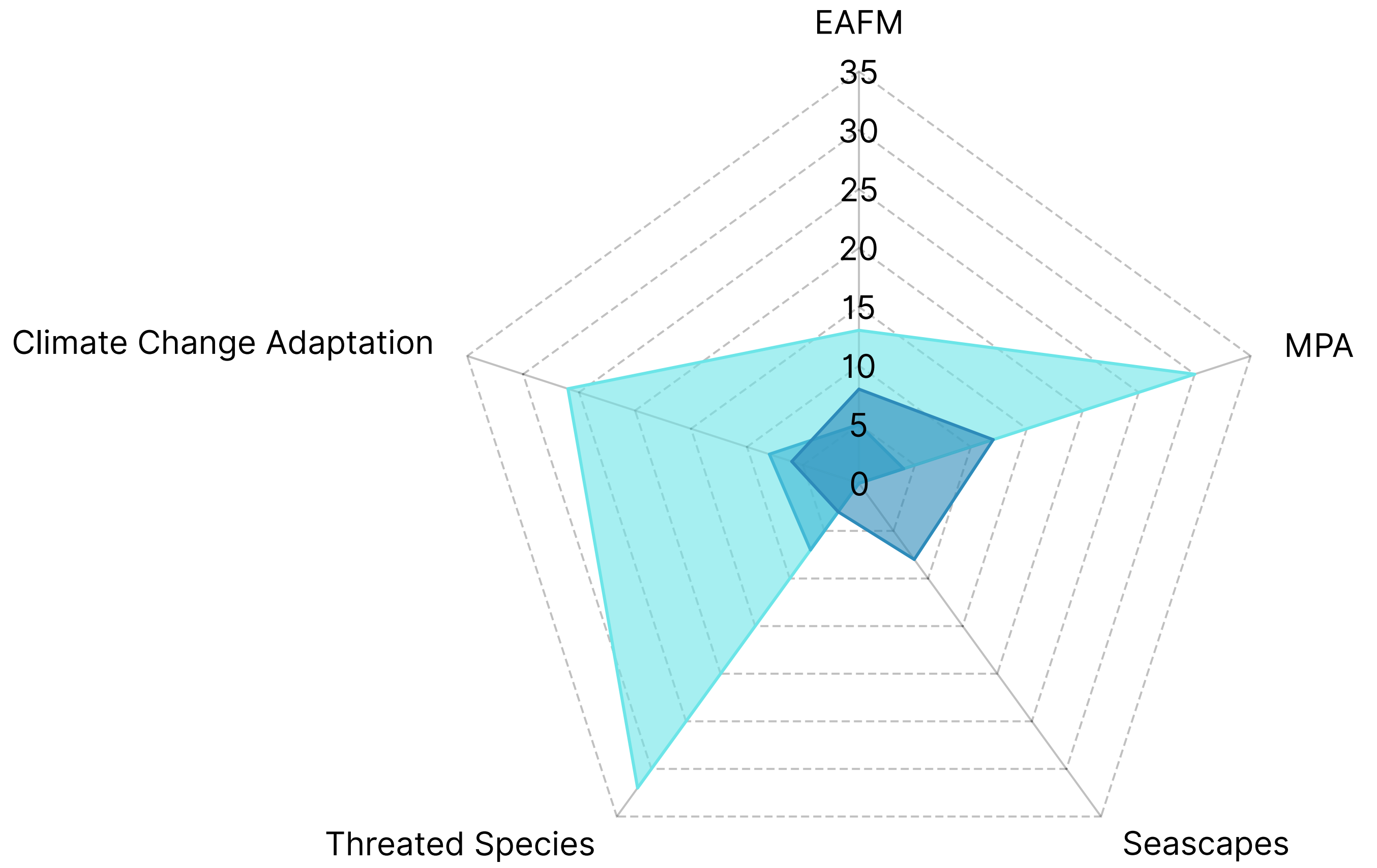

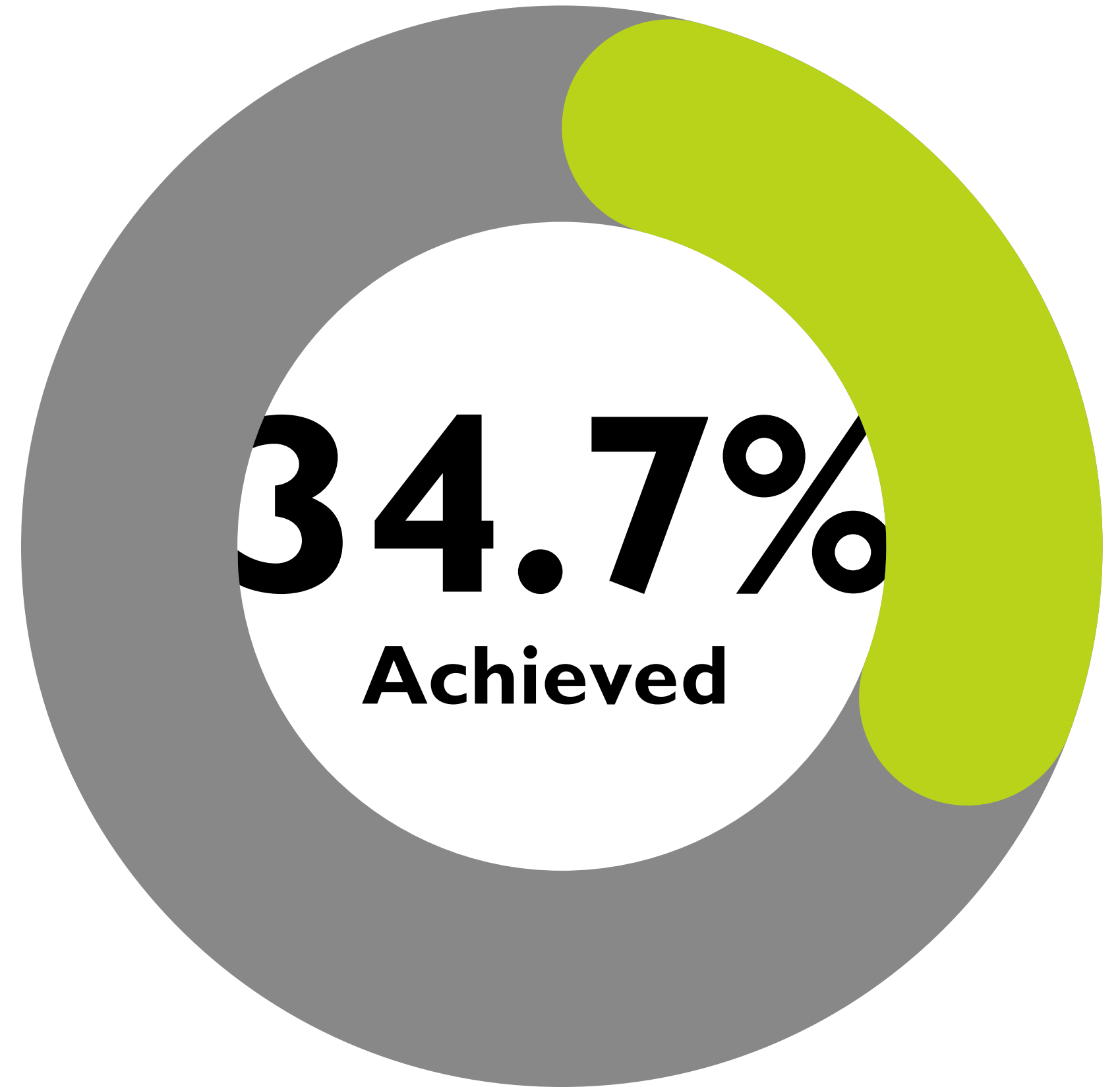

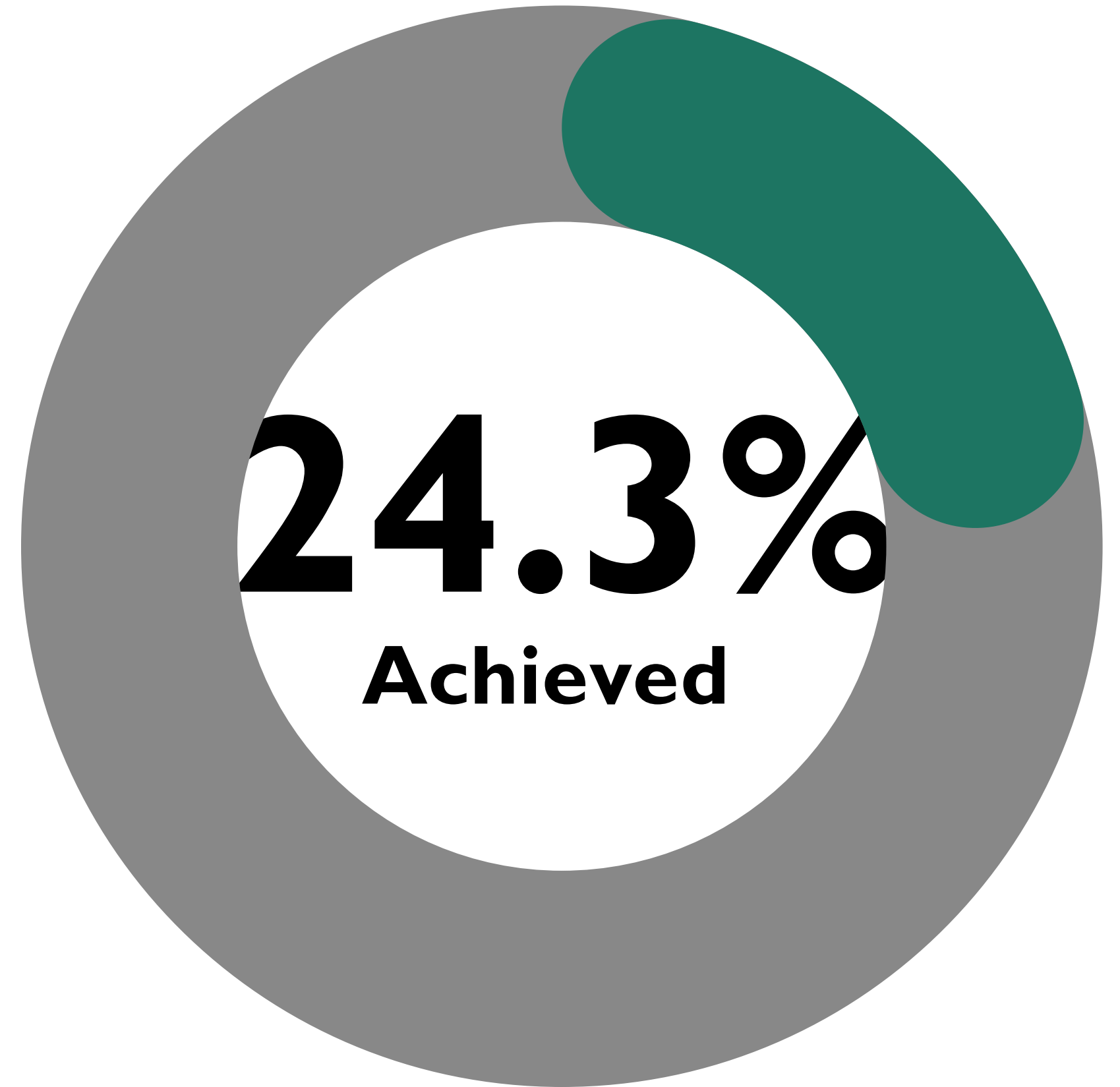


Seascape-related SOM-18 updates from the CT6

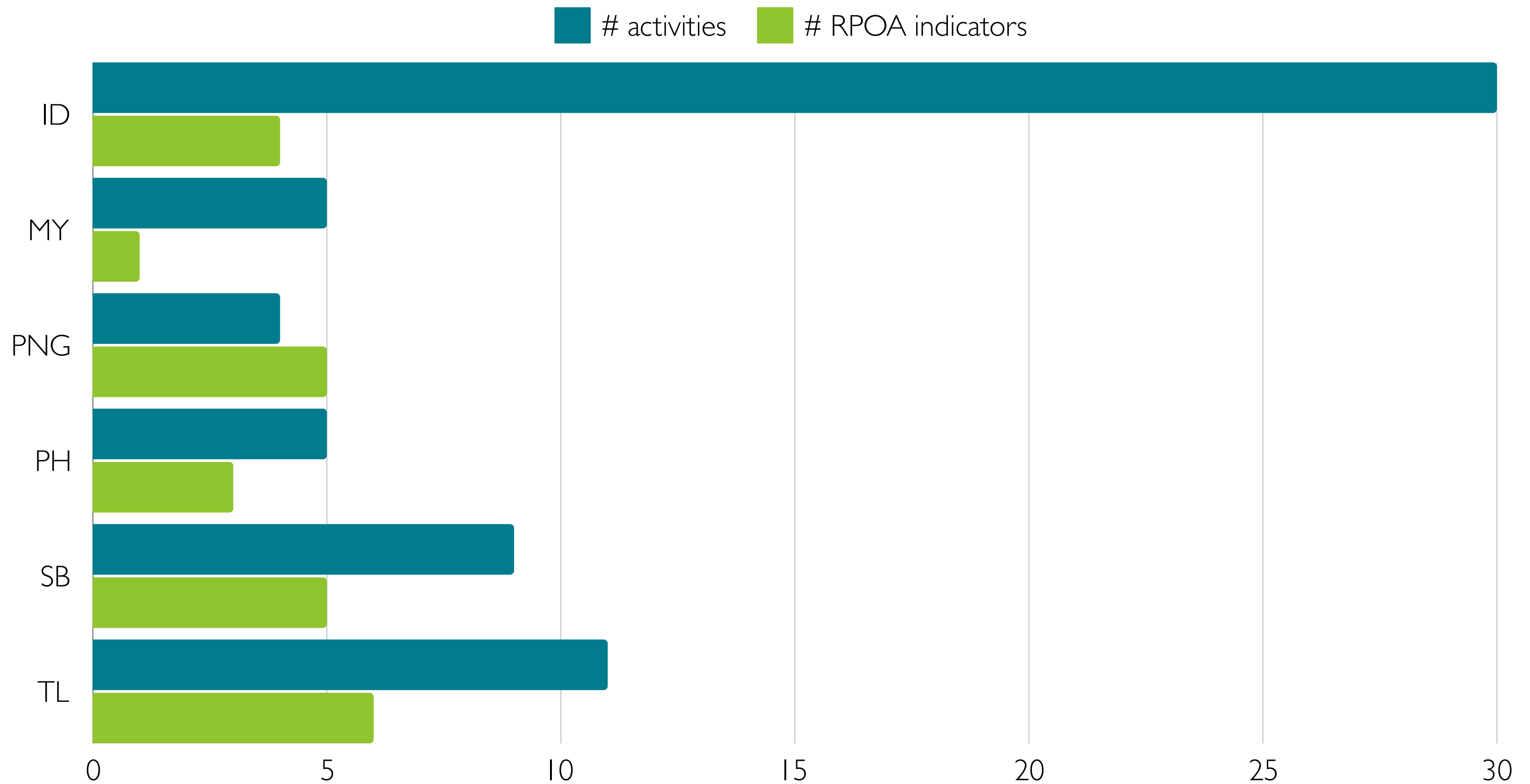

MPA-related SOM-18 updates from the CT6

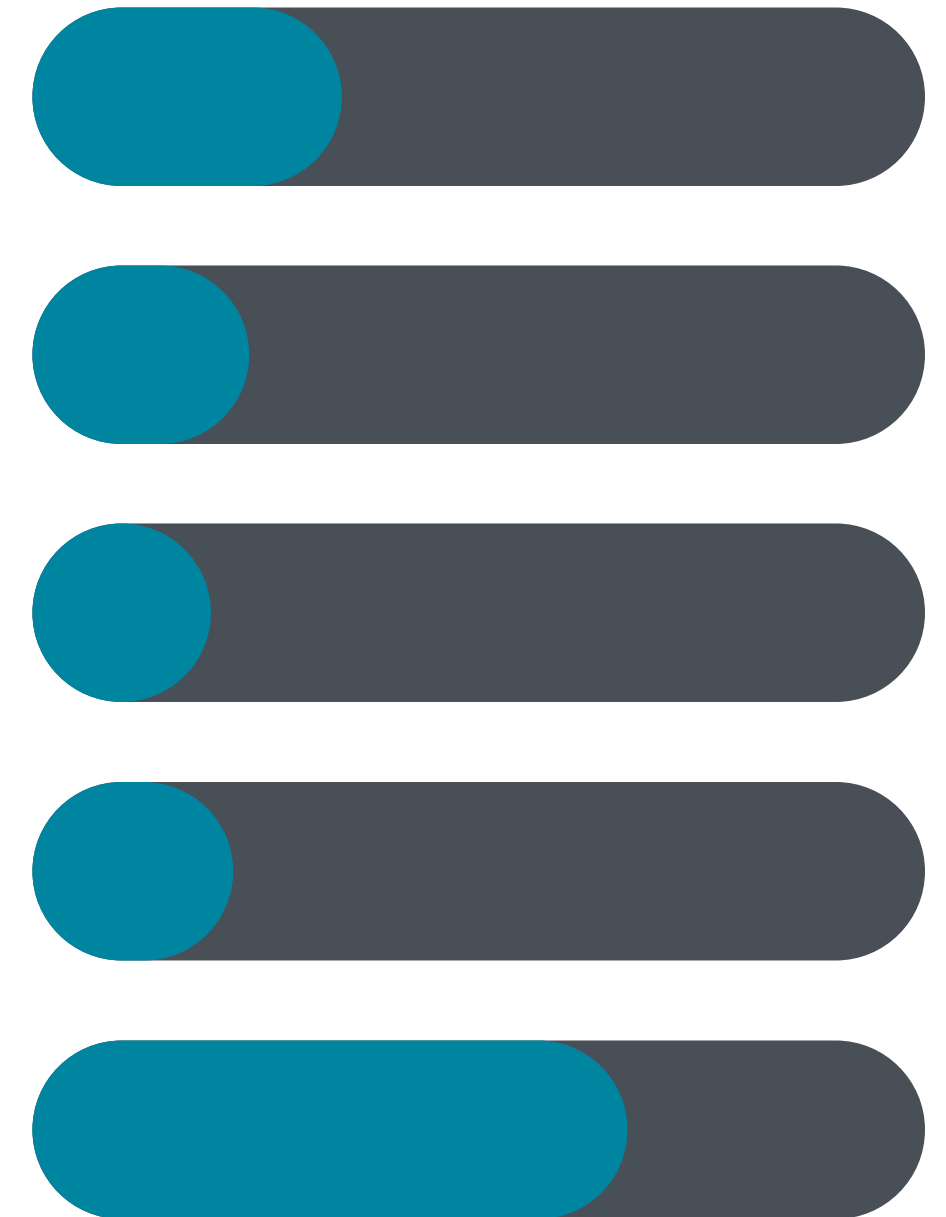
